He also claims the Secretary to the Council of Legal. Education, Mr John Wycliff has disoneyed a High Court order requiring him to issue the applicant with an enrolment cerlificate, by July 25, 1983, and lo register his articles of cierkship with Messrs Alexander and Kinjajui, i firm of advocates,

The order, Mr Theuri states in his application, was made by two High Court judges, Mr Justice

Emmanuel O'Kubasu Justice Fidahussein Abdullah on Attorney-General May 20. and it directed the the specific orders.

Among the orders was that the principal of the Kenya School of Law readmit Mr Theuri to the school to prepare for the cCouncil of Legal Education's examina-

Mr Theuri states that the principal, Mr Tudor Jackson, had complied with the order and readmitted him.

Mr Theuri also names allight
Court Judge, Mr Justice Abdul
Rauf, as having "erroneously
adjourned" a hearing of his
application (for the orders to be executed by arresting and jailing Mr John Wycliff Mwera) until an appent against the order by the Attorney-General was heard and decided.

He claims the adjournment and the failure by the other respondents to comply with the order was "highly prejudicial" to his legal rights by delaying his legal studies, his services under the articles of clerkship, and his pursuit of legal qualifications.

And he seeks the Court of Appeal's order to arrest the respondents and to appoint "other suitable persons or public officers" to execute the order "which would have been performantly the manager of the court of th med by the persons named.

in a related case, the court of Appeal dismissed an application by the Law Society to strike out an appeal by Mr Theuri.

The society wanted the Court of Appeal to strike out an appeal to the same court by Mr Theuri against an earlier High Court

ruling.

Mr Theuri had wanted the
High Court to restrain the society from what he alleged was interference in his articles of clerkship.
