

Question One (Compulsory)

Using the Law of Succession Act of Kenya, case law and any other relevant laws, discuss; -

a) The status of each of the women with regard to the estate of Mr. Lawi. (10 marks)

b) The status of the child Jim. (5 marks)

c) Division of deceased property. (10 marks)
