Tip: use the technique of Who?; Where?; When?; Elements; Pleadings; Issues; Evidence.

2. You are a prosecutor in the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions. The Director has tasked you to handle a case of murder.

On perusing the file, you discover that the death occurred in the home of the accused who claims that he was provoked by the deceased's suspicious intrusion into his home. Some other information suggests that the accused had laid a trap for the deceased who he suspected of carrying on an affair with the accused's wife. Prepare a comprehensive Opening Statement capturing all the elements of such a statement. (15 marks)

 - a) Prepare fifteen (15) questions in examination-in-chief of the plaintiff.
 - b) Prepare fifteen (15) questions in examination-in-chief of a surveyor whom you have called as an expert witness in the case. (15 marks)
